Lieutenant Colonel Jeffrey L. Wyatt is the Director of Support, Combat Readiness Training Center (CRTC) Gulfport, Miss. The primary mission of the Gulfport CRTC is to provide an integrated, year round, realistic joint training environment (Air Space, Ranges, Systems, Facilities, and Equipment) for units to enhance their capability and combat readiness. As Director of Support, Lt Col Wyatt is responsible for aligning the CRTC's logistical resources to meet the current and future training demands of the installation's reserve component and active duty customer base

Lt Col Wyatt enlisted in the United States Air Force in 1985 as a C-130 Crew Chief assigned to the 41st Electronic Combat Squadron, Davis-Monthan AFB, Ariz. In 1991, he joined the Ohio Air National Guard (ANG) as an Aerospace Ground Equipment Mechanic with the 123rd Tactical Control Squadron, Blue Ash, Ohio. After graduating from Northern Kentucky University, he was commissioned through the Academy of Military Science, McGhee-Tyson ANG Base, Tenn. and graduated Cyber Operations Officer training at Keesler AFB, Miss. in 2003. In his 34 years of service, Lt Col Wyatt has worked within multiple enlisted specialties, and served as Chief of Maintenance and Director of Plans & Programs. He is a veteran of Operations DELIBERATE FORCE, SOUTHERN WATCH, IRAQI FREEDOM, NOBLE EAGLE, and ENDURING FREEDOM. Prior to his current position, he was the Comptroller at the Gulfport CRTC.
